New assisted living opens at Deery Suites

Stanard Family legacy now honored on south campus

The first residents have moved into Western Home Communities' newest assisted living community on the first floor of Deery Suites.

"We anticipate this will be full of people who are thriving as they

age," explained Jerry Harris, president of Cedar Falls operations.

At a dedication ceremony on June 16, Harris called it a thrill to announce the name: Stanard Family Assisted Living at Deery Suites.

The moniker was first bestowed on Western Home Communities' original building downtown in December 2000, which stayed in use as an assisted living community until Oct. 2021 when staffing concerns caused by the pandemic brought about a consolidation with Windhaven Assisted Living.

Dave and Judy Stanard had made a generous gift in honor of his parents, Clair and Verona, who raised two sons at 12th and State Streets near the downtown campus. Clair served as principal of

Cedar Falls High School from 1938-1970. Verona was an original resident of Willowwood when it first opened in 1989 and lived there for 10 years.

"One of the reasons we got involved back in 2000 was that,

after having been around Western Home for so many years, I came to realize that this is a place where people should be giving their money," Dave said. "We hoped that our gift would spread the word that this is a legitimate place for people to support."

Harris credits Stanard for encouraging the organization to expand the foundation and pursue more philanthropic support.

"It's an important legacy you are continuing to leave through your heart and passion for this place," Chaplain Enrique "Q" Ochoa told Dave and Judy during the dedication.

The Stanards returned to Cedar Falls from their Arizona home for the first time in five years and invited long-time family friends to join them for the celebration. Present in spirit were his brother, Jim, and sister-in-law Nancy, who moved into a villa in 2010; Jim died in 2015 and Nancy in 2020.

"Life is very precious," Dave reflected, "and family is one of the greatest comforts."

New partnership will bring apprentice opportunities to Waterloo students

As part of a multi-pronged effort to attract and train new employees, Western Home Communities became a Partner in Education with the Waterloo Career Center at a signing event on June 9.

Through this partnership, Western Home Communities will be working with the WCC to create student apprenticeships where students can work within Western Home Communities as registered apprenticeship-certified nursing assistants (CNAs.) Chaplain's Corner: God's waiting room

Have you ever felt like you're in God's "waiting room"?

No doubt about it, waiting is hard. In the season of waiting, you're in good company.

Moses waited 40 years. Joseph waited 13 years. Noah waited 120 years. Abraham waited 25 years. David waited 12 years.

In Psalm 40, David declared, "I waited patiently for the Lord; he turned to me and heard my cry."

Not only did he say "wait." He said "wait patiently." It's one thing to wait, but to wait patiently, that's another thing!

James wrote to a dispersed group of believers who were being tested. He reminded them that "the trying of your faith produces patience. But let patience have her perfect work, that you may be mature and complete, wanting nothing."

During the waiting, a strong resolve to persevere is required. It's the stick-to-itiveness to "hang in there" and not let go even when it is difficult or unpleasant. This is the time to tether oneself to

God's promises. God made a promise to Abraham to bless him and give him many descendants. After he had waited patiently and endured, he obtained the promise (Hebrews 6:15).

Probably the most essential factor in the waiting room is trust in God. He is sovereign, perfect in love and infinite in wisdom. He never makes a mistake and his ways are perfect. We can trust God. He is trustworthy.

When the children of Israel complained that the Lord was no longer concerned about them, the prophet Isaiah gave them this encouragement:

"But those who wait and hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint." Isaiah 40:31.

Remember, God is at work while you wait.
